Set recipe for Class 93: Sunshine Cake

For the cake

- 225g/8oz self-raising flour
- 175g/6oz caster sugar
- 1 tsp baking powder
- 4 large free-range eggs
- 225ml/8fl oz sunflower oil, plus extra for greasing
- 100g/3½oz carrot, peeled and coarsely grated
- 100g/3½oz overripe banana, mashed

- 100g/3½oz courgettes, coarsely grated
- 75g/2¾oz chewy dried banana slices, broken into pieces

For the icing

- 100g/3½oz butter, softened
- 100g/3½oz full-fat cream cheese
- 1 tsp vanilla extract
- 225g/8oz icing sugar

Method

1. Preheat the oven to 180C/160C Fan/Gas 4. Grease two loose-bottomed 20cm/8in sandwich cake tins and line the bases with baking paper.
2. Place the flour, sugar and baking powder in a large bowl. Beat the eggs in a separate bowl, then add the oil, carrot, banana and courgettes to the eggs and stir. Add the wet ingredients to the dry ingredients and whisk together using an electric whisk until combined.
3. Divide the mixture between the two tins and bake for 25–30 minutes, or until well risen and lightly golden. Leave to cool in the tins for 10 minutes, then turn out onto a wire rack to cool completely. The cakes will shrink back a little when cooling.
4. To make the icing, place the butter and cream cheese in a large bowl and whisk with an electric whisk until combined. Add the vanilla and half of the icing sugar and whisk again until combined. Add the remaining icing sugar and whisk until light and fluffy.
5. Spread half of the icing over one cake. Sandwich the cakes together, then spread the remaining icing on the top and swirl. Arrange dried banana slices in a ring or spiral pattern on top of the cake

a) Display of **three** types of fruit or vegetables from the list below. The quantity of each type is given in brackets.

- Carrots (3)
- Cauliflower (1)
- Onions (2)
- Parsnips (2)
- Peas (6)
- Potatoes (3)
- Runner Beans (3)
- Tomatoes (3)

Entries are judged on size, shape, colour, condition and uniformity.

b) Vegetables must be displayed within an area measuring 18 by 24 inches. No part of any exhibit may exceed the size of the tray or board used to display the exhibit.

c) A black cloth is permitted and the tray may be painted. Parsley is permitted for garnishing but no other foliage or accessories will be allowed. Onion tops may be tied or whipped using raffia.

TOP VASE AWARD (Class 31)– Mixed vase of home-grown flowers
1st £10.00 / 2nd £5.00 / 3rd £3.00

a) Mixed vase of flowers containing 5 to 10 stems

b) Minimum of two different kinds of flower, not two varieties of the same kind.

c) The display will be judged on colour, form, condition, quality & freshness of the flowers.

Overall presentation & effect of the plants in the vase will also be judged. The vase will be viewed from all directions.

d) Plants used in the display should be showing flowers only; no seed heads or berries are allowed.

e) The vase can be any shape or size and made from any material. The vase must be in proportion to the display. No marks are awarded for the vase itself.

f) No accessories allowed e.g. bows and additional foliage. Foliage which is growing naturally from the flowering stem and still attached to the stem will be allowed. Packing material is allowed to keep the stems in place such as chicken wire, pebbles, flower frogs or other materials. Oasis or similar floral foam is not permitted.

Sunday 24th August 2024 at 9pm

All entries must be the property of the exhibitor and have not been entered previously.

Pot plants must have been in the possession of the exhibitor for a minimum of 6 months prior to show day.

Entry fee of 30p per exhibited by adults. All children's entries are free.

Entries are accepted from residents & employees of Kirkby Malzeard, children at Kirkby Malzeard Primary School, those within a 3 mile radius of the Mechanics Institute and the entire parish of Dallowgill.

*It is **where you live, not where you grow** that determines whether you can enter. If you live within the described area, but grow elsewhere please do join in.*

Exhibits must be delivered to the Mechanics Institute on the day of the show and staged (displayed) no later than 09.30.

Prize winners may detach counterfoils and claim prize money from 13:30.

Exhibits may not be removed until 16:00 to allow others to view.

On arrival exhibitors will be given an envelope stating the entry number allocated to their exhibit in each class. Exhibits should be placed next to the correct number for tabled entries.

The committee will not accept responsibility for any damage or loss and exhibits are accepted only on this condition.

Prizes are awarded at the judge's discretion.
